



8.1.1: Integration of different systems of health care in the teaching hospital

The Ayurved Mahavidyalaya Hospital provides treatment for many acute and chronic illnesses such as CKD, Cirrhosis of the liver, autoimmune disease, Ulcerative colitis, Arthritis, and Ascites. The institution is equipped with several health sciences systems, such as traditional medical sciences, Yoga, Physiotherapy, and a specialised Panchakarma section, to effectively manage patients. The institution organises and carries out Yoga sessions for patients receiving treatment at the hospital. These sessions include meditation therapy, Yogasana, and Pranayama, which are advantageous for the recuperation of patients undergoing treatment at the hospital. A certified Yoga teacher is available to conduct these sessions. The institute's NSS team conducts awareness programmes for the rural communities in close proximity. The institute features a comprehensive Physiotherapy Unit that caters to both adult and paediatric patients, with the presence of highly skilled physiotherapists. For people afflicted with arthritis, cerebrovascular accidents, musculoskeletal problems, and other neurological illnesses. The institute provides facilities to provide emergency medical treatments. Highly skilled medical doctors specialising in contemporary medicine (Allopathy) are ready to treat urgent medical disorders such as Hyperglycemia, Uncontrolled Hypertension, Acute conditions, and different crises. A fully prepared ambulance, staffed by experienced personnel in basic life support, is accessible 24/7 on campus to facilitate the rapid transport of patients experiencing lifethreatening medical conditions. The Hospital has a well-equipped radiology department that includes a non-obstetric and digital X-ray unit, overseen by a radiologist. The Ayurved Mahavidyalaya has established Memorandums of Understanding (M.O.Us) with many multispecialty hospitals.
