4.3.5: In-person and remote access usage of library and the learner sessions/library usage programmes organized for the teachers and students

Ayurveda college library's provision of in-person library services during the COVID-19 pandemic. The current scenario of the pandemic is as follows, namely for instructors and students: 1. Students, teachers, and research researchers have access to 24-hour, 360-day broadband internet via Wi-Fi connection. They may use this connectivity to access online materials from presented web links as well as other publicly accessible sources. They each constructed their own WhatsApp online accounts, organised by year.

2. Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya offers remote login access to UG institution users. Students and faculty members are provided with a remote login option to access online and digital resources from their homes, subject to the following criteria.

Procedures implemented by an institution for the establishment of this service. The institute established hyperlinks to Google Classroom, GoToMeeting, and Cisco Webex. The user ID and password were sent to all pupils via a WhatsApp group. The timetable, which outlines the programme, has been established and distributed to all students. User Id arranged chronologically by year Procedures followed by users to access the facility Students are required to download and install the Google Classroom, GoToMeeting, and Cisco Webex programmes on their Android smartphones. They are directed to retain internet data. Each kid was directed to provide their email address to the administration. Attendance at each meeting should be mandatory, requiring participants to log in using their unique user ID and password. Guidelines regarding internet use Online journals and e-databases are accessible to users. The data obtained from these online journals and e-databases, accessed remotely or on campus, is used only for educational and research purposes, without any intention of commercial exploitation. If a user violates any condition, they must be prepared for any consequences or disciplinary measures, which will be determined by the management. Each user will have a daily browsing/download restriction of 100 MB. The E-Granthalaya software is accessible to all students. Furthermore, the institution provides a dedicated Departmental Library for all students to facilitate their academic endeavours.
